
Snapshot of Services - 2015

Treasurer's Report

2015 was another good year from the view of financial support. We were particularly grateful for the Grant from the grant from the ITF Seafarers' Trust which allowed us to purchase a newer 2014 van and for Corporate Donations from the Port of Thunder Bay. Our Fund raising activities showed a moderate improvement this year thanks mainly to the improvements from the Dinner. The Meat Sale was at about the same level it has been in over the last few years.

The purchase of the van at \$42,260 was our major expense for the year. Considering the \$11,000+ we spent on rental last year, this was a reasonable expense that will be realized in about 4 years.

We also were able to reduce our indebtedness to the Diocese to the point where we owe about \$10,000 and are looking at reducing that significantly again this year. We thank you for your support throughout this year and look forward to it again in what appears to be another busy year. Brad Yeo
