## **Direct Ministry**

- ⇒ Provide ministry to seafarers and port personnel who request our services.
- ⇒ Visit seafarers aboard ocean-going ships in the Port of Thunder Bay.
- ⇒ Transport seafarers to shopping, the Seafarers' Center and upon request to worship or for a tour of city.
- ⇒ Operate the Seafarers' Centre as a welcoming place where seafarers are provided with an opportunity to connect with volunteers and relax. Seafarers are offered free of charge:
  - communications facilities to contact their family;
  - ♦ Bibles in various languages; and
  - ♦ warm clothing.
- ⇒ Deliver Christmas Gift Bags to crew on oceangoing ships in December.
- Offer an annual Blessing of the Fleet service for local mariners.

- ⇒ Educate the community about seafarers and enhance the profile of the Mission in the community.
- ⇒ Attract, train and retain volunteers.
- ⇒ Fund raise to operate the local station and provide for capital improvements.





## **Treasurer's Report**

2017 was another good year financially. Our overall income of \$48,960 was down about \$6,500. Our expenses were \$45,784, which was down about \$1,500 from 2016. This resulted in a surplus of \$3,175.


This surplus helped us navigate the traditionally slow donations during the first quarter of the new year and to maintain currency with the Diocese throughout the year. We also increased our support of the Chaplain to 2 ¼ days per week.

The Capital Fund has maintained a balance of about \$3,500. However, the Board has a list of projects to the Structure of the Seafarer Centre that have been estimated at \$9,000. Additionally, the Centre needs to be leveled and placed on a solid foundation. We are investigating how to accomplish this, including how to fund it.


We thank you for support over the past years and look forward to your continued support in 2017.
