SYNOD

Synod opens with a service at St. Luke's Cathedral at 7:00 pm on Wednesday May 8th followed by a reception at St. Andrew's United Church hall, 712 Wellington Street East. Delegates attending the opening service are requested to park at St. Andrew's and walk to St. Luke's to avoid parking congestion at the Cathedral. The open offering at this service will go towards our support of theological education.

Synod will come into session at The Water Tower Inn at 8:30 am on Thursday, May 9th.
