People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by

the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered

under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He

descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come

again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion

of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the

life everlasting.

*Presider* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the

breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Presider Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin,

repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

*Presider* Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

Presider Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as

yourself?

**People** I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the

dignity of every human being?

People I will, with God's help.

*Presider* Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect,

sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

People I will, with God's help.

has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, through our Lord Jesus Christ.

I always felt that Michael Bedford-Jones was a true gift from God for us at St. George's. When you were talking to him, whether it was about something serious or something fun, he was equally engaged. He had an excellent sense of humour, and he also had a very kind approach to understanding things that were serious, important, and needed to be dealt with. His memory for names and individual strengths was amazing, and everyone at the Cathedral felt valued by him. When he left us to go on to be a Bishop we all knew that he would be an outstanding example to others, and would make everyone he interacted with feel highly valued. 
