### **Lighting of Candles**

People participating via the live stream are encouraged to light candles as the following is said,

Archbishop: Come, O Spirit, giver of life.

Make your face to shine on us, that we may be saved.

People: Come, Holy Spirit, come!

*Archbishop:* From many peoples and places, we come to this house of prayer.

We gather at Baawating, the place of the rapids, an important gathering place of Indigenous peoples

for thousands of years to this day.

This is Robinson-Huron Treaty territory, the traditional land of the Anishnaabeg,

specifically the Garden River and Batchewana First Nations,

and the Métis.

As we offer our evening sacrifice of praise, we pray the light of the Creator will guide us all

on the path of truth, justice-seeking, healing, and reconciliation.

O gracious Light, Lord Jesus Christ, in you the Father's glory shone. Immortal, holy, blest is he, and blest are you, his holy Son.

Now sunset comes, but light shines forth; The lamps are lit to pierce the night. Praise Father, Son, and Spirit: God who dwells in the eternal light. Worthy are you of endless praise, O Son of God, life-giving Lord; wherefore you are through all the earth and in the highest heaven adored.

Advisor to the Archbishop of Algoma.

Elder Willard Pine is escorted to the chancel by The Rev. Lana Grawbarger, Incumbent of St. John's Church, Garden River.

The Dean reads the Certificate of Commissioning.

The Archbishop continues,

Elder Willard Pine, I am humbled and grateful that you have agreed to serve as my Indigenous Spiritual Advisor. You are a beloved and widely respected Anishinaabe elder, always generous in offering your stories and wisdom to any who will listen. In this way you carry on the tradition of your father, Elder Dan Pine, and the vision of your great ancestor, Chief Shingwauk. You have a lifetime not only of teaching, but also of healing. Deeply rooted in your belief in prayer and the sacred fire, you continuously help people who seek your hospitality and guidance. You walk the Red Road seven days a week, and you support your wife, Marie, by your involvement with St. John's Church in Garden River. Together, you, Marie, and your family are a living testimony to the way of love, goodwill, and generosity.

Archbishop: Let us stand in prayer.

Blessed are you, Creator God.
We give you thanks for the many ways you reveal yourself in the lives of your beloved peoples.
We pray for Indigenous Elders, for those who keep the teachings of their people, and for all who work for the wholeness and health of their communities.

We give you thanks for Elder Willard, and for the wisdom, joy, and generous spirit so evident in him. Continue to bless him, and to bless others through him.

Help us to listen, and break open our hearts in love, that we might receive and care for each other well, grow in new understandings of our past, and be led in ways that value life, healing, and wholeness. Blessed are you, Creator God, now and for ever.

### **Installation of an Honorary Canon**

*Archbishop:* I call forward Fran Glover to be named to the Chapter of Canons
