The 10 sections are to help you assess your work with children and young people. The most important thing to remember is not to agonise over the questions. Self assessment is simply a tool to help you identify how to work towards becoming more child friendly.

### 1. Parish has Child-Friendly Policy and Structure

Is a parish volunteer Screening In Faith process in place and being implemented?

Does your parish have a child/youth ministries coordinator?

Is a list of volunteers held by the Church Council?

Do all volunteers have a clear role description?

Do all those who are in high risk ministries with children / young people possess a Criminal Records Check?

Are all activities authorised by the Church Council?

Are all activities adequately insured?

### 2. The Church Buildings Offer a Safe Environment

Are group areas warm and clean?

Are leaders aware of potential hazards, for example: electrical points, protrusions, heaters etc. in all places for children?

Are leaders aware of emergency procedures?

### 3. On-going training and support for leaders

Does your church encourage volunteers to attend training programmes, run by the diocese or other agencies for all those who come into contact with children / young people?

Are there opportunities to discover & update resources?

Are leaders affirmed or commissioned in a church service?

Do you pray for your leaders?

Are leaders trained in basic first aid?

### 4. There is provision for nurturing children/young people: 0-16

Do you provide Sunday and/or mid-week groups for children / young people aged between 0 and 16 years?

Are you meeting the needs of each child / young person in terms of their social, physical, intellectual, emotional and spiritual development?

Are there opportunities for children / young people to explore the Bible, encounter and experience God?

Is there regular prayer for these groups?

Do you take into account people with special needs?

Is your Church Council sympathetic to spending requests?

Have you included youth and children's work as part of your church budget?

# 5. There are opportunities for children / young people to be included in child friendly church services

Are any of your services all-ages services?

Do any of your services focus on a particular age-range?

Are the children / young people welcomed as individuals in their own right?

Does the service leader introduce and explain things clearly?

Is the length and structure of the service appropriate for children? / young people, e.g. Do children have the freedom to move around?

Are leaders involved in any / all aspects of child / young person friendly services?

Are your service resources appropriate? e.g. books/papers?

### 6. Suitable materials for under 5's are available in church

Do parents/carers with young children know about your toilet/baby changing facilities?

Do you allocate a special 'area' for parents / carers to feel comfortable with babies and very young children?

Do they have access to good quality quiet toys, books and activities?

Do you have a system for welcoming families? e.g. Welcome Pack pre / post Baptism

Do your greeters orient new families to the children's facilities?

# 7. There are opportunities for the voices of children and young people to be heard

Do you invite young people to attend and observe your church council meetings?

Are children and young people involved in the leading of services?

Are children and young people involved in worship planning & children's group planning?

Does the church run a Christian club for the school?

Are families encouraged to attend worship in school or church?

#### 10.Outreach

Do you have regular events / activities which draw in children / young people from outside 'the church'?

Do you have special events / activities which draw in children / young people from outside 'the church'?
